Chair, Department of Family and Community Medicine

The Ohio State University College of Medicine and Wexner Medical Center seek an exceptional academic physician with proven leadership skills to serve as the next Chair for the Department of Family and Community Medicine. This is an exciting time for a new leader to join our forward-thinking organization. The Ohio State University College of Medicine and Wexner Medical Center are undergoing nearly \$3 billion in capital improvements to include a new hospital tower, a new Interdisciplinary Health Sciences Center, a new interdisciplinary research building and expanding Innovation District on West Campus to promote and expand cross-disciplinary research and ideation. Additionally, a strategic expansion of ambulatory and surgical services is underway, beginning with the newly opened Outpatient Care New Albany. Two additional sites, Outpatient Care Dublin and Outpatient Care West Campus, are scheduled to open within the next two years.

The Department of Family and Community Medicine is composed of 93 Faculty (78 Physicians, 7 PhD faculty, and 8 psychologists), 15 APPs, 27 residents, 5 fellows, a large compliment of ambulatory ancillary providers, and 9 administrative support staff. The Department contains unique clinical subsets including Integrative Medicine, Sports Medicine, Occupational Medicine, Primary Care Addiction Medicine, Transgender Care, and Psychology. The Department supports 14 ambulatory care locations including primary care offices, occupational medicine, and an ambulatory mobile clinic. Medical Education within the department includes all providers participating in medical student precepting, a 3-year residency program, and fellowships including ACGME-accredited Sports Medicine (2 fellows), integrative medicine (1), primary care ultrasound (1), and behavioral health (1). Additional fellowships include clinical informatics in collaboration with Nationwide Children's Hospital and an APP Fellowship program in collaboration with Ambulatory services.

Research efforts within the Department of Family and Community Medicine are multidisciplinary and focus on a variety of topics including clinical quality and outcomes, patient satisfaction, telehealth, health equity, and community health and wellness. Many faculty members in the Department conduct research through The Center for the Advancement of Team Science, Analytics, and Systems Thinking (CATALYST) in Health Services and Implementation Science, a college-wide Center focused on advancing research and discovery at OSU in the delivery of Health Services across the continuum of care using a data-driven Team Science approach. Investigator-initiated research drives the Department toward its goal of being a nationally and internationally recognized leader in research and scholarship.



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The next Chair will build on the accomplishments of the current Department by increasing its presence on the national/international stage through promoting innovative research, strengthening the academic mission and bolstering the delivery of leading-edge care to the residents of Columbus and beyond. The successful candidate will possess strong leadership skills, foster a culture of collaboration, innovation and excellence and embrace the values of diversity, equity and inclusion.

Qualified candidates must possess an MD, DO or MD/PhD, board certification in Family Medicine and be licensed or eligible for licensure to practice medicine in the state of Ohio. Proven and substantial experience defining and leading the clinical, academic and research mission of a department within an academic medical center is required, as is the ability to be a collaborative thought-leader in a large, multi-faceted medical center.

The Ohio State University College of Medicine, with more than 4,500 learners, is the only academic medical center in central Ohio. Ranked as the 7th most diverse medical school by U.S. News & World Report in 2021, it is known nationwide for curricular innovation, pioneering research and outstanding patient care at The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center. With more than 1,800 faculty members, the college comprises 19 clinical departments, seven basic science departments and the School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences.
